Concerned at reports from his son's landlady, Kakhi departs Tbilisi for New York's Brighton Beach bearing gifts of cheese and good advice. But Soso is in desperate need of hard cash: he's thousands of dollars in the hole to a local gangster. Undeterred, Kakhi sets about making things right. Levan Koguashvili's disarmingly simple and poignant movie is a deceptively modest, small-scale character piece, but imbued with such charm and generosity of spirit that it lands with unexpected gravity.

Set in a devastated Ukraine in 2025, "a year after the war", this 2019 Venice prize-winner is an astonishingly vivid vision of love among the ruins. Structured as a series of artfully composed tableaux, the film tells the story of Sergey, a former soldier suffering from PTSD. When the foundry where he has been working closes, he joins a volunteer outfit exhuming the battlefields—which is where he meets Katya, a former architect. Despite the bleak surroundings Vasyanovych finds unexpected shards of hope.
